

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## International Specialist Courses

### Gynaecological cancer: new perspectives

26 November – 1 December 1989, London

This seminar will discuss controversial issues in gynaecological cancer, the best management of rare tumours and how care can be improved in rare situations.

The seminar will be under the direction of **Dr Peter Blake, Mr John Shepherd and Dr Eve Wiltshaw** of the Gynaecological Cancer Unit, The Royal Marsden Hospital, London.

The seminar is intended for experienced physicians, gynaecological surgeons and scientists involved in the day to day management of gynaecological cancer.

There are vacancies for 30 participants.

The seminar sessions will take place at The Royal Marsden Hospital, Fulham Road, London and resident participants will be accommodated at a nearby hotel.

### Breast cancer: new developments in biology, diagnosis and treatment

3 – 9 December 1989, London

The aim of this course is to review what has been achieved and to look ahead to see how new developments in many relevant fields might lead to further advances in our ability to control breast cancer.

The course will be under the direction of **Professor R D Rubens**, Imperial Cancer Research Fund (ICRF), Department of Clinical Oncology, United Medical and Dental Schools of Guy's and St Thomas' Hospitals, University of London.

The course is intended for clinicians and scientists in all fields of medicine concerned with the biology and treatment of breast cancer.

There are vacancies for 35 participants.


Fee: £490; accommodation charge: £305.

The working sessions will take place at Guy's Hospital and resident participants will be accommodated at a hotel in central London.

Participants who are accepted for and who attend both courses will be eligible for a discount of 20% of the total of both course fees. The amount payable will therefore be £740. Participants who wish to be resident should of course add the accommodation charge when making payment.

**Prescribing Information**

**Uses:** Hismanal is a potent and non-sedative antihistamine indicated for the treatment of seasonal and perennial allergic rhinitis, allergic conjunctivitis, chronic urticaria and other allergic conditions.

**Dosage and administration:** adults and children over 12 years: 10 mg daily. Children 6-12 years: 5 mg once daily. Children younger than 6 years: 2 mg per 10 kg daily. Hismanal should be taken on an empty stomach. **Precautions:** Hismanal should be used in pregnant women only when, in the judgement of the physician, the potential benefits outweigh the possible hazards.

**Adverse reactions:** weight gain may occur during prolonged treatment. **Overdose:** in case of overdose, gastric lavage should be followed by close observation and ECG monitoring as arrhythmias have occasionally occurred after intake of doses in excess of 200 mg.
