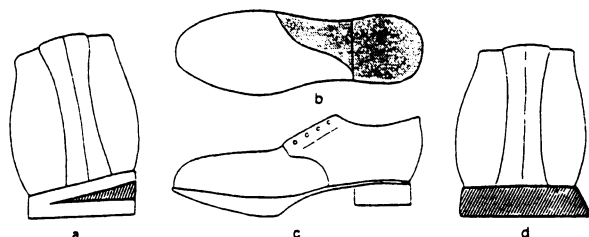

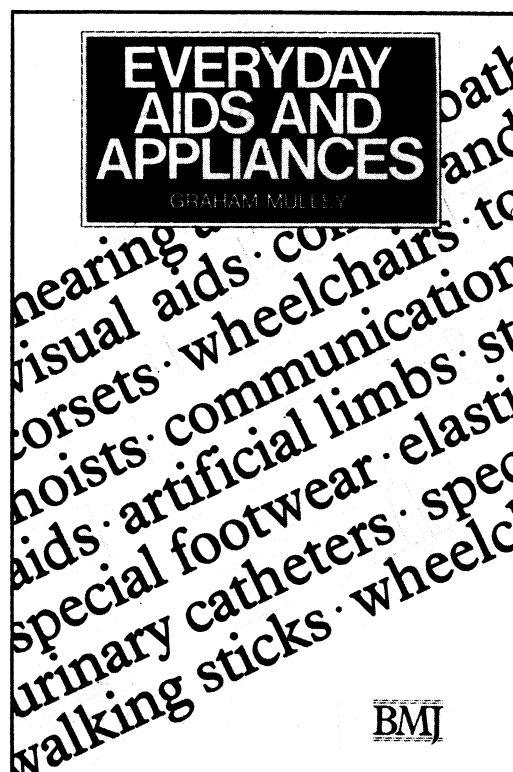

The Natural History of Disease by John Ryle, with an introduction by Michael Shepherd. First published in 1936, this collection of 34 lectures and essays is written in an unpretentiously clear and elegant style, setting out Ryle's observations on disease states and the principles underlying his work and his holistic approach to medicine. Startlingly relevant today, the book is also, as Michael Shepherd states in his introduction, a classic in its own right.

Swerving Neither to the Right nor the Left: Essays to honour Ian Munro. Ian Munro retired as editor of the *Lancet* at the end of 1988, and to mark the occasion friends and colleagues at home and abroad published a literary substitute for the traditional carriage clock. In it they pay tribute to Munro's qualities as editor, cricketer, liberal campaigner, and soother of hurt authors' feelings. You don't have to be Ian Munro to read and enjoy this book: a limited edition of 100 copies is published by the Keynes Press.

The Great Malaria Problem and its Solution by Ronald Ross. Introduction by L J Bruce-Chwatt, emeritus professor of tropical hygiene at the University of London. Adapted from Ross's memoirs, this Keynes Press edition gives the full story of his discovery of the mode of transmission of malaria by the *Anopheles* mosquito. Engagingly written, it provides a fascinating insight into the process of scientific research as well as a self portrait of one of the most impressive and colourful individuals in the history of tropical medicine.

The Fatal Illness of Frederick the Noble by Morell Mackenzie. Introductions by Harold Ludman, consultant ear, nose, and throat surgeon, King's College Hospital, and Jonathan Steinberg, fellow of Trinity Hall, Cambridge. Mackenzie's account of his part in the treatment of Crown Prince Frederick of Prussia for a tumour of the larynx, a case that, besides arousing violent disagreement about acceptable medical practice, historically had far reaching repercussions throughout Europe.

IAN FRASER

In the *Blood, Sweat, and Cheers* of a surgeon's life the blood needs no explanation; the sweat is the hard work; the cheers are the satisfactions of getting good results. For Ian Fraser the sweat was increased as much of his early surgery was performed in the heat of battle in the second world war; and the cheers come also from his capacity to enjoy himself in almost any circumstances. Former president both of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland and of the British Medical Association, Sir Ian Fraser is eminent in his profession, but his book is not about being eminent, it is about life and its pleasures and pains, told with zest and humour and delightfully pictured in Ghislaine Howard's illustrations.

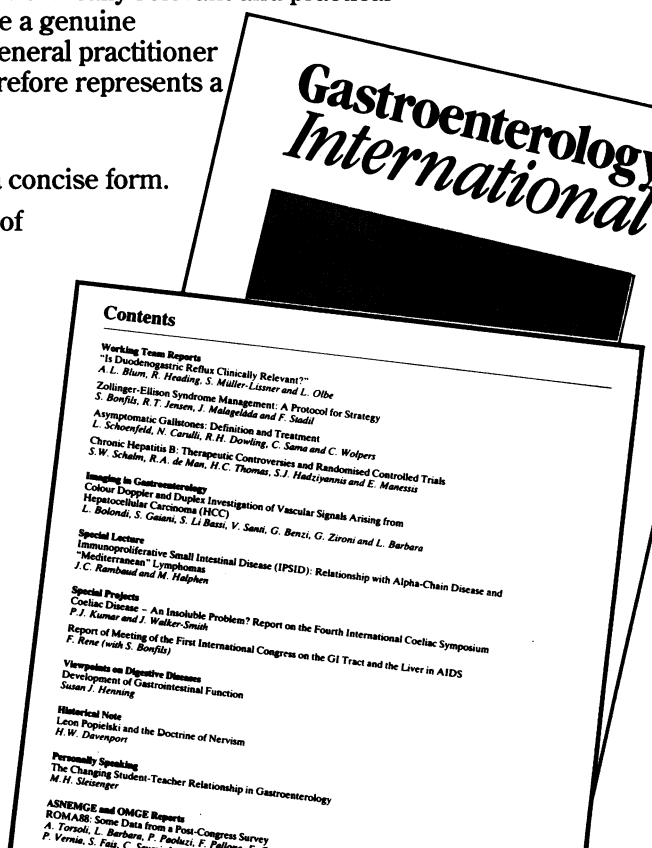

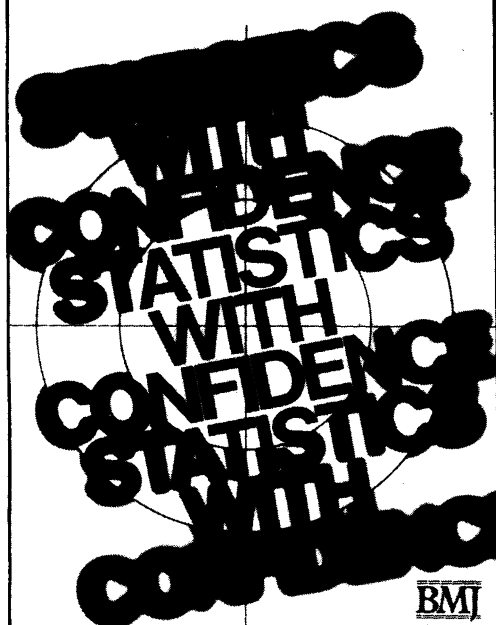
