International Medical Course

Epidemiology: chronic disease control and prevention

15 - 21 June 1990, Cambridge

This course will focus on the principal areas of current interest in the epidemiology of chronic disease, with particular emphasis given to the implication for primary and secondary prevention, and to quantitative methodology. The main disease areas covered will be cancer, cardiovascular disease, stroke, diabetes, dementias and AIDS.

The course will cover the following topics: measuring disease incidence and prevalence; the principles of case control and cohort study design; quantitative modelling of exposure-disease relationships; analysis of case control and cohort studies - the estimation of risk; community based intervention studies; genetics epidemiology; the principles of mass screening and the value of early detection; the epidemiology of AIDS - quantitative models for prediction and intervention; the epidemiology of cardiovascular disease, stroke, diabetes, dementia and various forms of cancer - implication for control and prevention; the assessment of dietary intake for epidemiological studies.

The course will be directed by **Professor N E Day**, Professor of Public Health, University of Cambridge.

The course is intended for clinicians with a role in preventive medicine; non-clinical epidemiologists; experienced scientists and research workers.

There are vacancies for 30 participants.

Course fee: £540; accommodation charge: £425; total fee: £965.

The course will be held at the Clinical School in Cambridge. Participants will be accommodated in a conveniently placed hotel.
