


Forty minutes prior to undergoing tonsillectomy, a child weighing 29.1 kg. received a single i.m. injection of 10 mg./kg. lincomycin hydrochloride (base equivalent). A sample of the patient's tonsil tissue was placed on a Petri dish in which the agar had previously been seeded with a pathogenic strain of *Streptococcus haemolyticus*. After incubation, a photograph was taken. The clear zone demonstrates that Lincocin penetrated the human tonsillar tissue in a concentration sufficient to inhibit the growth of the pathogenic inoculum. (The small white dots appearing at one end of the tissue sample were identified in subsequent studies as colonies of non-pathogenic Gram-negative *Neisseria catarrhalis*.)

# An aid to oral hygiene

Maintenance of oral hygiene during the post-operative period, especially among geriatric patients, is obviously essential. But at the same time this can prove to be somewhat time-consuming for the nursing staff.

However, recent experience in a London hospital has shown that the patient can help to provide his own nursing care, with the minimum of effort.

This experience covers patients who are fed intravenously and post-operative cases who find normal eating and drinking difficult. These patients often exhibit signs of mouth infection very quickly, and treatment for this can often cause considerable discomfort.





Strain-gauge plethysmography is one of several techniques for evaluating blood flow in limbs. These tracings were produced using this technique: the steepness of the slopes of the tracing is representative of blood volume. In this instance the patient suffered

from Raynaud's phenomenon in both hands. The tracing above shows blood flow in the finger before treatment, and that below after treatment with OPILON (thymoxamine). The dramatic increase in blood flow is as much as fifteen times.




