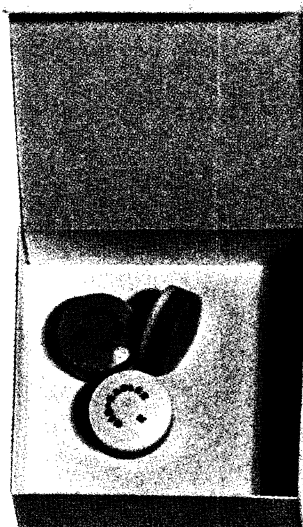

Description

Neo-NaClex-K is a film-coated two-layer tablet containing the thiazide drug bendroflumazide in the white layer and potassium chloride in the pink layer. The potassium chloride crystals are embedded in protective material which is designed to release potassium chloride gradually, so minimising gastro-intestinal irritation. Potassium taken in this form is well absorbed.

Indications

Essential hypertension. Neo-NaClex-K may be used alone, or in conjunction with other antihypertensive drugs, when either the dosage of the latter can be reduced, or full doses can be used to control resistant cases which do not respond satisfactorily to either drug alone. When Neo-NaClex-K is used alone, the fall in blood pressure may range from 20 to 40 mm Hg systolic and from 10 to 30 mm diastolic.

Administration and dosage

The usual dosage of bendroflumazide is 5 to 7.5 mg daily, but a few patients need only 2.5 mg, while others need 10 mg. Larger doses do not give a correspondingly greater therapeutic effect. When Neo-NaClex-K is used as a supplementary drug, the dosage of the other antihypertensive drug is normally gradually reduced as the Neo-NaClex-K takes effect.

Side effects and precautions

Neo-NaClex-K is a relatively safe drug and side effects of treatment are uncommon. Mild anorexia or indigestion is rare and can be avoided or reduced by taking the dose during or immediately after a meal. Symptoms and signs which might indicate ulceration or obstruction of the small bowel in patients taking tablets or capsules containing potassium salts are indications for stopping treatment with such preparations immediately. These complications are usually associated with enteric coated preparations, and are unlikely to occur with Neo-NaClex-K, which is designed to release potassium chloride slowly. Skin reactions have been reported in a few patients and blood dyscrasias have occurred rarely. Diabetes mellitus with glycosuria, and raised serum uric acid levels (with or without gout), may occur in some patients, especially in those who are susceptible to these disorders.

Contra-indication

Renal insufficiency complicated by hyperkalaemia.

A Doctor in the RAMC enjoys the best features of two professions— wide clinical experience and the rewarding life of an Army Officer.

IT TAKES a long, long period of intensive (and expensive) teaching to turn a medical student into a Doctor. Then, as far as Society is concerned, it's up to the Doctor to justify his training.

As far as the Doctor is concerned, of course, it's hardly as simple as that. First of all, he has his medical ambitions to consider. Does he want to be a General Practitioner? Does he want to specialise? What are the chances of his doing what he really wants to do? And second, he has—very reasonably—to consider his private life. Will he be able to afford to get married? To have children? To have a decent house to live in, and decent holidays to recharge his batteries?

Good medicine—and a good life

If he answers these questions in the context of service in the RAMC, he will discover some good reasons for considering practising his medicine in the Army. To serve for three or five years will give him varied clinical experience, and the chance to make up his mind if he wants to make his career in the Army.

Among the medical reasons is the close integration of all aspects of medical care—preventive medicine, general and hospital practice—with

surgeries organised by groups, and supported by hospitals. Medical Officers can personally follow up the cases of patients admitted to hospital. Surgeries are very well equipped—and are, of course, financed by the Army, not by the Doctor. The Army also provides a trained staff for each surgery; an RAMC Medical Officer's wife does not have to do any secretarial chores.

Then, take the personal reasons. The Army helps Medical Officers with families in many ways. Most are provided with furnished houses at low rents. There are all sorts of allowances: for marriage; for educating children at boarding school in Britain (not taxable while the parents are stationed abroad); for moving house; for living abroad, and others. There is the companionship and community spirit of Army life. And there is six weeks' paid annual leave with no need to provide a locum.

£3,000 tax-free after 5 years

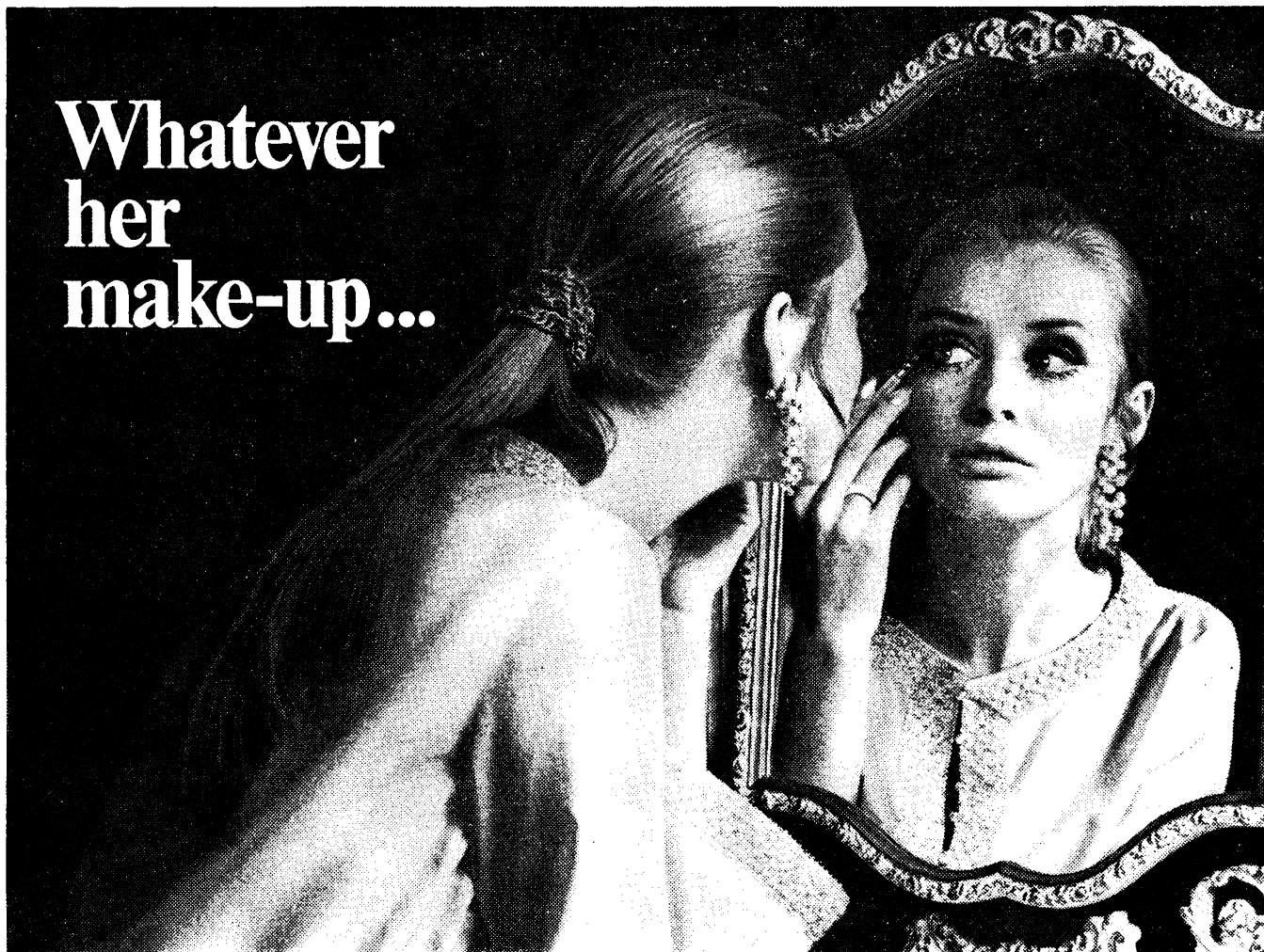
The RAMC needs both Regular and Short Service Officers. Normally, to be a specialist, a Doctor has to become a Regular Officer; the Army pays for all his post-graduate training, and though it's no easier to rise to a Consultancy in the RAMC than

in civilian life, RAMC specialists tend to do very well. Approximately 36% of all Officers do in fact specialise. GPs can be Regular or Short Service; and 3 or 5 years as a Short Service GP in the Army is something every young Doctor should consider seriously. In that time, he will have a good chance of travel; be well paid and housed; and leave with a useful tax-free gratuity (£1,500 after 3 years—£3,000 after 5) to help start him off in his civilian practice.

For doctors who prefer, there is now a Special Regular Commission to complete 16 years' service (which may be extended or lead to a Permanent Commission). Some former service may be reckonable. Promotion, pay and allowances are the same as for Permanent Officers, as is retired pay and terminal grant for Officers of equivalent rank and service. Specialist training will be according to Service requirements in the specialty applied for.

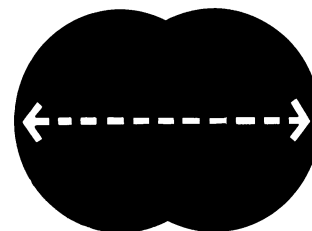

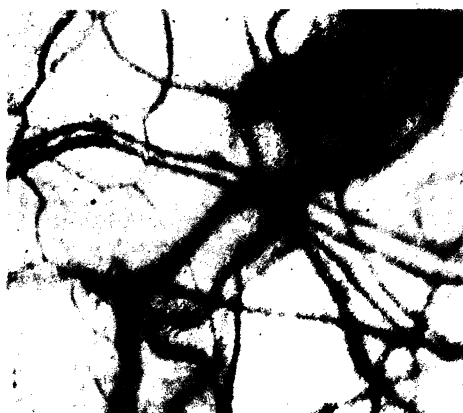
