



Including works by Rabelais, Sir Thomas Browne, Goldsmith, Keats, Schiller, Ronald Ross, William Carlos Williams, and Dannie Abse, this beautifully produced limited edition is published by the Keynes Press to mark the 150th anniversary of the BMJ.

## DID ED, BMJ, MURDER HIS WIFE?

upposedly based on rumoured events in the life of Ernest Hart, a great but undervalued editor of the *BMJ*, Frank Danby's novel *Dr Phillips: a Maida Vale Idyll* was first published in 1887. Unlike many popular Victorian novels it is concisely plotted; the characters are sympathetic and believable; and the author's presentation of Jewish life in the late nineteenth century is uncompromisingly honest.

But is the character of "Dr Phillips" a portrait of Hart? In his introduction to the Keynes Press edition Stephen Lock, present editor of the BMJ, places the novel in its literary and historical context and examines the character and achievements of Ernest Hart. Finely bound and printed, and with illustrations by Tabitha Salmon, this edition of Dr Phillips: a Maida Vale Idyll will fascinate those interested in literature, history, and the BMJ.








Tabitha Salmon's frontispiece from Dr Phillips: a Maida Vale Idyll by Frank Danby


