

On the way there have been rows, editors' dismissals, and battles with the BMA and royal colleges as well as growing success and authority. In *Mirror of Medicine* the historian P W J Bartrip provides a shrewd and perceptive commentary on the *BMJ*'s progress, placing its history in the context of contemporary events and examining its treatment of many key themes in medical science and society, including public health, military medicine, quackery, sex, and the birth of the NHS. He also provides pen portraits of some of its most outstanding editors, among them the charismatic Ernest Hart, his successor Dawson Williams, and the doughty Hugh Clegg. The *BMJ*'s present editor, Stephen Lock, provides a postscript on the state of the *BMJ* today.
