

Are the ills of middle and later life rooted in our early development?




uring the past few years a series of articles, mostly from the Medical Research Council's Environmental Epidemiology Unit at the University of Southampton, has been published in leading medical journals. They set out the evidence thereertain adult diseases, including coronary heart disease; stroke and diabetes originate in impaired development during fera life and infancy. Because of the obvious implications for prevention of some of the commonest diseases in-Western society, they have attracted international attention. 




