The accessory apparatus is explained, a chapter given upon mounting, collecting, preparing, injecting, polarized light, and the application of photography. The author then proceeds to point out the most interesting objects for study, commencing with infusorial animalcules, zoophytes, sponges, mollusca, crustacea, articulate, which includes a very interesting account of many insects. He then passes on to the structure of animals, and lastly, that of vegetables. Thus we have the lowest and the highest forms of life illustrated. The adulterations of articles of food are not forgotten, especially that of flour, bread, coffee, etc. Altogether, it is a complete cyclopaedia of information, omitting nothing essential to the study of microscopic science in all its varied details. The whole forms a decidedly good and popularly-written work of the ever-interesting study of the invisible and minute parts of creation."—*Illustrated London News.*
