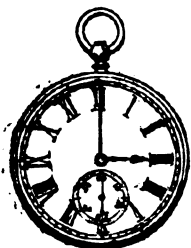

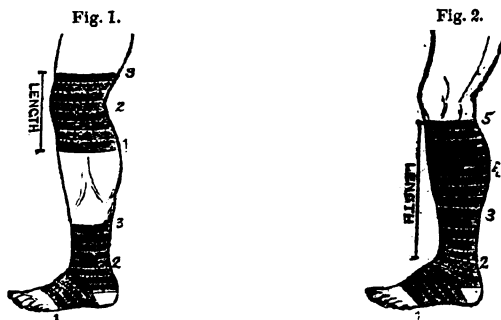


Fig. 1. KNEE-PIECE AND ANKLE-PIECE.—These may be worn together or separately. The former is especially useful in chronic enlargement of the knee-joint, weakness in the articulation, &c. &c.; and the latter should always be used after subsidence of the inflammatory stage in sprains, dislocations, &c. &c.

Fig. 2. THE WHOLE SPIRAL STOCKING.—Most valuable in varicose veins, oedema of the leg, from various causes, &c. &c. No cure of varicose veins can be expected without it, and the stocking should be used even after the tortuous vessels have been tied. The spiral pressure may be increased or diminished on any point.
