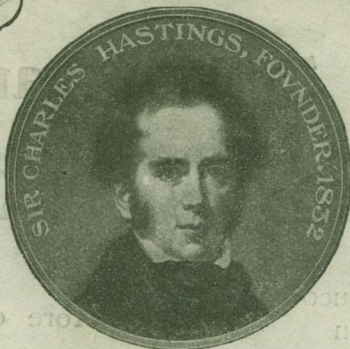

Fig. 3.—Illustrates another type of the cyanosis, in which the colour of the lips and ears arrests attention in contrast to the relative pallor of the face. Patient may yet live for twelve hours or more.
