For those who have had repeated attacks of epidemic influenza, it may be preferable to employ the more comprehensive ANTI-CATARRH VACCINE (Prophylactic) which was particularly designed for immunization against ordinary nasal and bronchial catarrhs.

The above-mentioned vaccines are supplied in sets of three graduated doses for the immunization of one adult; also in ampoules of 1 c.c., and in bottles of 25 c.c.
