

Note on the use of Dimol
in
SURGERY

In view of the experience of a large number of observers who have found that the growth of gas-producing organisms which cause severe pain after abdominal operations may be effectively controlled by the use of Dimol, a distinguished surgeon has suggested that its free administration, both before and after the operation, would obviate the discomfort and pain which only too often follow such surgical measures.

As the experience of surgeons has proved that flatulence, if not controlled, may even imperil life, the above procedure should be worthy of serious consideration.
