## THE PRESENT STATUS OF DIABETES TREATMENT.

The chances of the diabetic patient are better to-day than at any time in the history of medicine. Carefully prepared statistics show that the duration of life has greatly increased, and with, the extension of knowledge of the disease and of modern treatment, will probably continue to increase.
