EDITOR'S CHOICE



This week's main news has been the £2 billion increase for the NHS in 1989-90 (p 1217), a welcome higher than inflation boost that nevertheless failed to soothe the unrest among nurses about the outcome of their clinical grading exercise (p 1221). Research workers, however, may feel soothed by an increase of 16% in the government's science budget (p 1218). Greater efficiency in the NHS's budget has been an unyielding aim of this government: accurate information is essential for this, but Skinner and Riley, reporting on performance indicators (p 1256), warn of the risks of amplifying inaccurate data. Warnings from Dublin and Birmingham (pp 1211 and 1212) that a fifth of patients with borderline hypertension may be treated unnecessarily remind doctors not to rush into treatment without careful assessment. The link between bad housing and

health may seem obvious, but Dr D P Strachan (p 1223) shows how hard it may be to disentangle cause and effect in his study of asthmatic children in damp housing. The effects of ejection on car accident victims are, surprisingly, disputed, but on p 1244 the Oxford Road Accident Group concludes that ejection causes more deaths and serious injuries than would otherwise happen. In the start of a new series, Controversies in Therapeutics (p 1260), Drs G D O Lowe and P J W Scott polarise the arguments about anticoagulant drugs in the elderly. Finally, Jane Salvage, a nurse from the King's Fund, finds it ironic as a health authority member (p 1278) to be "silently cheering" those "arrogant asses in white coats" whose "rampant individualism" is that "last bastion of a service built on a collective ethic to benefit the whole community."
