## **EDITOR'S CHOICE**



"The way we live now" is not just the title of one of Trollope's most subtle (and unappreciated) novels: it applies equally well to life in the year before another of the belle epoques that characterise the final decade of a century. Di Ferdinand's description of the dehumanising management of her 82 year old mother (p 46) is a human example of the statistics in Tony Smith's leader on our inadequate health service (p 1). Whether the current overt violence in our society is more or less than it was is debated in the

correspondence columns (p 46), with a reminder not to forget the role of alcohol. And across the Atlantic George Dunea reminds us of the bogus—unqualified medical imposters and quack remedies (p 58). Fortunately at least somebody has come up with an answer to one problem: what to say to the snoopers who inquire about sexual and personal habits (p 59). Oliver Samuel's practice has had a rubber stamp made that reads "we are not willing to answer questions about lifestyle." Bravo!
