

To mark its 150th anniversary in 1990 the "BMJ" presented the BMA with five chandeliers to hang in the Prince's Room at BMA House. Designed, crafted, and installed by Waterford Crystal Ltd of Waterford in the Irish Republic, these comprise four corner chandeliers together with a central one, shown in this watercolour by Yvonne Fuller.

The central chandelier has 18 arms

The central chandelier has 18 arms giving a total illumination of 720 watts; its height is 6 ft, width 4½ ft, and weight 165 lb; and there are 234 pieces plus the button chain. It is hung 10½ ft above the floor from the 22½ ft dome.

At a special ceremony on 5 December the chandeliers were switched on by Mrs Gilian Keable-Elliott, wife of the chairman of the Journal Committee.
