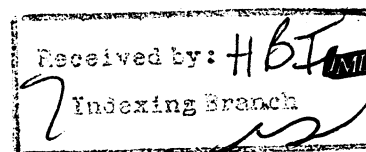

While some of our correspondents continue to struggle with recruitment problems in clinical trials (p 1271), Michael O'Donnell's account of ISIS-3 in Atlanta shows that even successful trials may have their problems (p 1259). In this case the revelations were accompanied by European-American tensions, high drama, and Damascene conversions. For those, closer to home, who have had enough of the dogfighting over the NHS (p 1233) a health economist urges us to lift our

sights to the promise held out by the reformed NHS (p 1253), but John Bain's general practitioners are clearly finding this hard to do, bogged down as they are with paperwork and a heavy workload (p 1247). We hope it won't stop them reading because this week we start a new series—"A paper that changed my practice"—with a tribute to Virginia Smallpiece, 90 this month and responsible with Pamela Davies for stopping the routine starvation of preterm babies.
