EDITOR'S CHOICE

David Morrell, one of Britain's first professors of general practice, damns the new general practitioner contract for flying in the face of most research produced from general practice (p 1313). This governmental practice of ignoring the results of research seems widespread. In the case of the evaluation of the NHS pilot initiative to give clinicians control of resources the government didn't even wait for the evaluation to be finished before declaring it a success (p 1291). Our correspondents on the issue of whether we need more psychiatrists or fewer thus needn't be too "depressed" by the thought of "central planners" watching eminent psychiatrists take opposing views because they probably won't pay attention anyway (p 1339). Debate is what we need, and at the moment the "mores" are in the ascendancy. *Helicobacter pylori* is, meanwhile, stalking our pages again—accused now of causing not only duodenal ulcer (p 1333) but also gastric cancer (p 1302). Let's hope that this is not yet another 20 year wonder.
