## EDITOR'S CHOICE

The much heralded government strategy for health has finally appeared and is summarised on p 1355. Not to be outdone the Labour party produced its strategy the day before (p 1356). Next week we will carry editorial comment on the documents and then we will get to work dissecting the government's strategy. Traditionally in Britain and other countries—it is politicians who produce plans for reform and doctors who then react as best they can. Now the BMA is trying to make itself more proactive by producing its ideas on how the health service should work, and the General Medical Services Committee has published a strategy document on how general practice might develop in Britain. On p 1380 we carry the first of a series of articles responding to the questions raised in the GMSC's document: Denis Pereira Gray argues passionately for more resources for research in general practice. AIDS features prominently in this issue: Don Jeffries argues that all hospitals should be able to give zidovudine within an hour to staff occupationally exposed to HIV (p 1349); a collection of papers shows how HIV infection is underdiagnosed and underreported (pp 1365, 1375, 1376); staff from the Royal Free describe the success of their clinic for testing for HIV and giving the results the same day (p 1383); and John Kurtz warns that adopted Romanian children may be infected with HIV and hepatitis B virus (p 1399). Finally, Brian Witcombe describes what it was like to be out of control on a bike careering down a Cotswold hill (p 1409); the piece will leave you literally breathless.
