EDITOR'S CHOICE

What would you do if consulted by a couple infected with HIV who wanted treatment for infertility? A group of doctors from St Mary's Hospital in London faced just such a problem, and on p 1447 they tell us what they did and others tell us what they would have done. There are no easy answers for this ethical dilemma, but it looks as if we might be getting closer to agreement on the best drug to give for thrombolytic treatment of myocardial infarction—streptokinase, which is both effective and relatively cheap. In what is likely to be the last placebo controlled trial the members of GISSI dispel a remaining anxiety by showing that streptokinase did not increase the risk of a cerebrovascular event overall (p 1428). Our recent paper on allergy to penicillin has provoked much correspondence, but there is consensus that many people who think they are allergic to penicillin are not and that the history is of more value than any investigation (p 1462). Finally, Caroline MacEwen and Nicholas Jones describe how in Britain sport has taken over from work and road accidents as the commonest cause of eye injuries (p 1415): two fifths of injuries result from sport, and half of those requiring admission to hospital suffer some permanent damage to their vision. Indoor racquet sports are one of the main causes, and the message is that eye protection should be worn.
