# **EDITOR'S CHOICE**



Extracontractual referrals are a problem that simply didn't exist before 1 April this year, but now they consume much management time, effort, and angst—together with several of our pages this week (pp 479, 497, 499). It is reassuring to learn from directors of public health that they are allowing reasonable requests for patient choice, but ultimately money or lack of it will limit that choice. And, as J D Williamson suggests, concentrating such effort on a relatively small number of patients is not the best use of resources. A better use is suggested by Roger Higgs in his editorial on vocational training (p 480), while David Jewell suggests that if undergraduate medical education is redesigned to provide young doctors with basic

principles and a critical approach then by 2011 general practitioner trainees will spend their trainee years learning "real medicine" (p 510). Dr R M Humphreys, whose obituary appears on page 518, undoubtedly practised real medicine in his years in the Sudan treating leishmaniasis, but not until he had played rugby for the Barbarians and survived the Gallipoli campaign. The debate about J shaped curves continues in the correspondence columns—this time it's alcohol consumption and coronary heart disease (p 521)—while Drs Gama and Featherstone take an unfashionable line against protocols in clinical practice, arguing that they may waste resources and increase costs (p 522).
