### EDITOR'S CHOICE

Unemployment and the organisation of health care should loom large in the coming general election in Britain, and both are covered in this week's journal. It is now well established that unemployment kills, and the research challenge is to work out how. Joan Morris and others show (p 536) in a longitudinal study that the increased alcohol consumption and smoking that have been seen among unemployed men in cross sectional studies are present before the men lose their jobs-but they do put on weight after becoming unemployed. Last week saw the publication of the proposals for the health service of the Labour party and the Liberal Democrats (p 526). Rudolf Klein analyses Labour's proposals and finds, beneath the rhetoric, some continuities between its plans and those of the government (p 517). In his political comment Jack Warden points out that the similarities between the proposals made by the two opposition parties may be important if Britain ends up with a hung parliament (p 528). Ken Grant, meanwhile, takes the long view on the various models of delivering health care (p 566).

Whichever party wins the election, the recently formed Clinical Standards Advisory Group will presumably continue, and Sir Gordon Higginson, its first chairman, lays out in a letter on p 571 exactly what it will be doing. But whatever the problems of the British health service, they are as nought compared with those of the Romanian and Russian services-both of which are described this week (pp 556 and 563).

A development in this issue is the reappearance of drug points in a different form (p 548): formerly published at the end of the correspondence section, they will now appear after the short reports. Finally, we publish (p 569) an obituary of J A Elliot in the form of a poem by his son, a much published poet. Reflecting on his father's childhood Alistair Elliot writes:

> The books may well survive. The one I'd like, perhaps on a tray in the rain now, marked "10p," is Vanity Fair, in which the boy got stuck half up the tree of knowledge. I would look for the words he read, to everybody's glee, "He was a man of charming gravy-tea."
